

# Finding and Printing Resources from the Resource Directory

The Resource Directory is an easy-to-use information clearinghouse to help you find services and information to support your successful reentry. We have listings for such things as hot meals, free and sliding scale medical and dental care, support to break free from addiction, licensing limitations, employment and training centers, pro-bono offices and housing options and much more. A list of our categories, and another list of where resources can be found (local, state or national), are located to the right of the form. If you know of services and other resources that we have not listed, please let us know so we can make this information available to others!

Click on the Resource Directory link on the home page:



Then type (or select) the state and city where you wish to look for resources, then click on **Search Resources**:

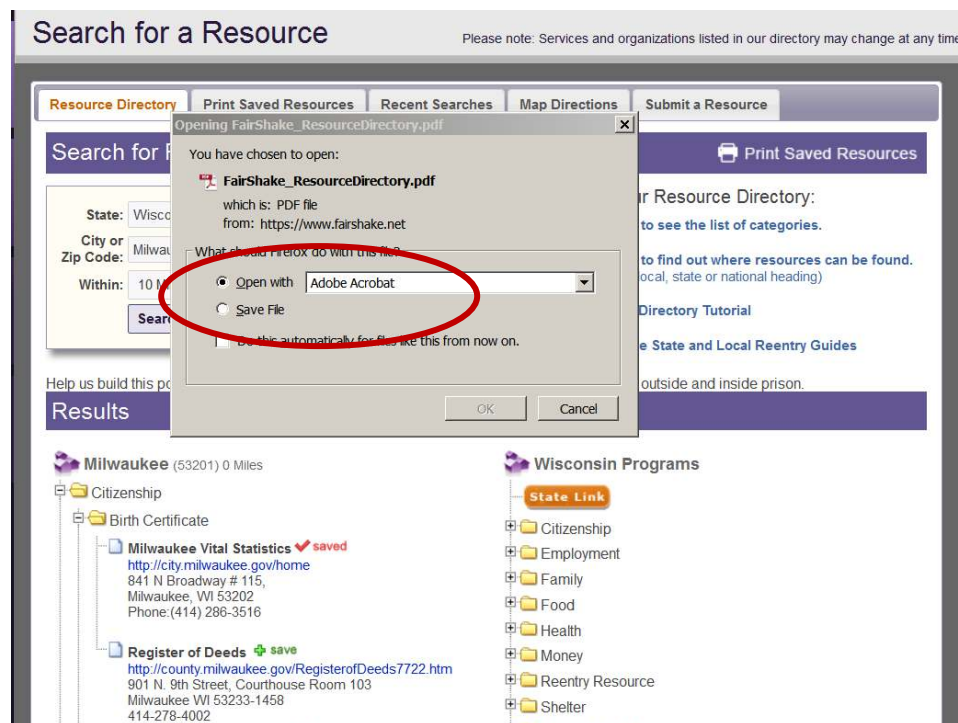

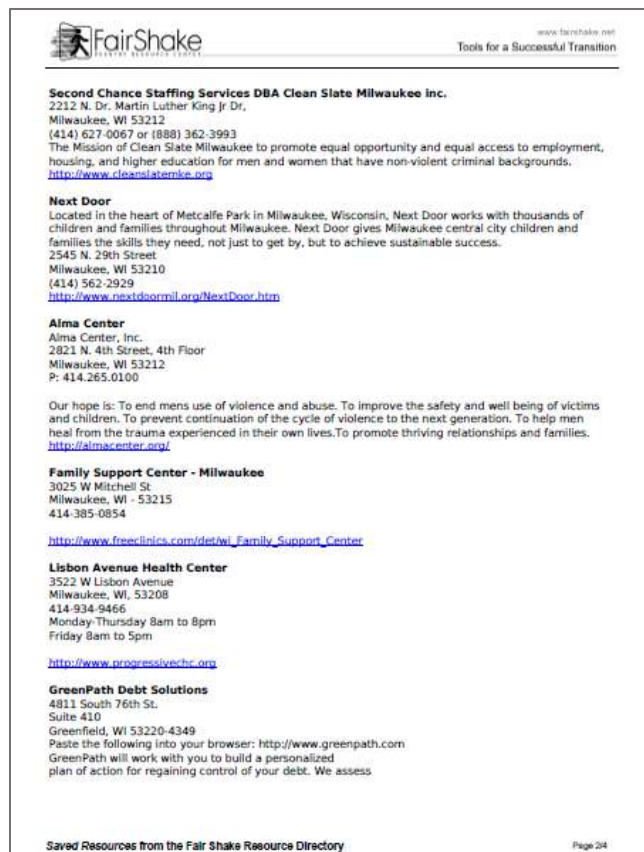

**Print Saved Resources**

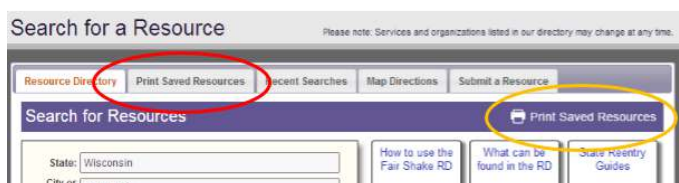
If you click on the button within the gold circle you will see the small window below here you can decide if you'd like to save the document on the computer or simply open it for printing.

(you may have several pages)



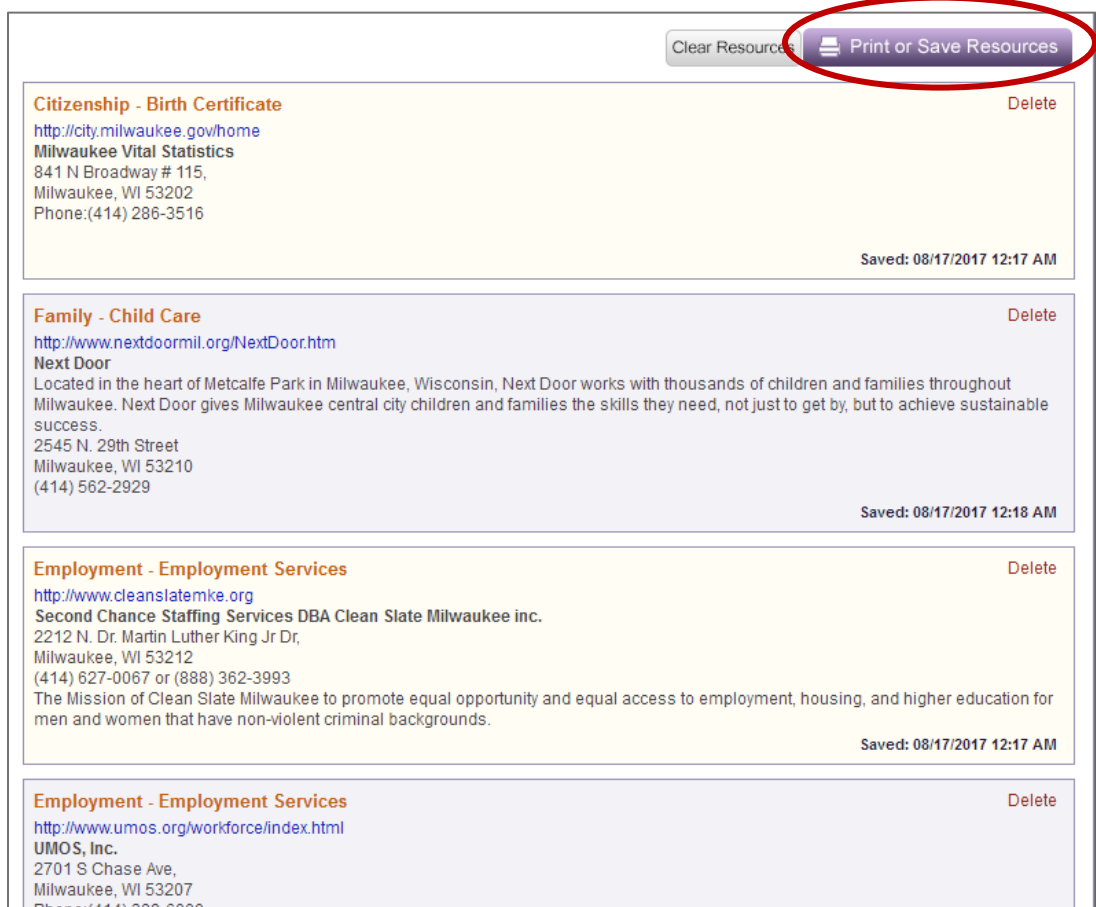
If you clicked on the tab with the red circle:
