### County Re-entry Task Forces are located across New York State

Task Forces are located in New York City and upstate counties and are designed to help individuals who are returning to their communities after release from state prison. Two state agencies - the Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) and Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (DOCCS) - collaborate to oversee these Task Forces.

Each Task Force works with DCJS, DOCCS, county and community agencies, and human service providers to help eligible individuals get programs and services that meet their needs when returning to the community.

### The Task Force in your community may be able to help you:

- Find a job and/or a place to live.
- Obtain identification such as a nondriver's license or Social Security card.
- Receive assistance to change negative behavior.
- Reconnect with family and community.
- Find services to promote your growth and good behavior.

### Re-entry Services are available in 19 counties

Re-entry case management services may help you meet Parole conditions while accessing other needed services including:

**Employment**: You may receive help with writing resumes, developing interview skills, obtaining job counseling and finding a part-time or full-time job.

**Housing**: Obtain transitional, temporary or permanent housing.

<u>Thinking for a Change</u>: Task Forces have trained staff to help provide this program, which is designed to help change negative thinking and reduce your risk of committing a new crime.

**Substance Abuse Treatment**: Task Forces may work with alcohol and substance abuse service providers who may be able to help you get needed treatment.

<u>Education/Training</u>: Task Forces may place you in GED programs, adult education, vocational training or college prep courses.

## Task Forces may be able to help:

- Individuals assessed by DOCCS as Supervision Level 1, 2 or 3.
- Women with high service needs.
- Sex Offenders.
- Individuals who served their entire sentence and are released from prison without supervision. (Maximum Expiration)
- Teens and young adults on parole or recently released from an Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) residential facility.
- Individuals with mental illness, severe medical issues, those with hearing, visual or physical impairments or those who are developmentally disabled.


