

What is an ADRC?

The Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) is a public office where people can find help in their communities for older people and adults with disabilities, as well as their families and friends. Our staff is available to answer your questions and help you explore all of your options. Free, private, confidential meetings with our staff are available at the resource center, over the telephone, email, or in a visit to your home.

Benefits counseling – Accurate and current information on private and government benefits and programs. "Red tape cutters" on problems related to Medicare, Social Security, and other benefits.

Dementia support - Connects individuals, and their family and friends, to community resources that can provide opportunities to remain active, involved and supported.

Family caregiver services – Consultation with individuals and families, support group, respite programs, educational materials.

Health & Wellness Programs – Healthy living programs, falls prevention workshops, nutrition education, and caregiver support workshops.

Information & Assistance – Consultation and advice about the options available to meet an individual's support and care needs, including enrollment into publicly funded programs (Family Care and IRIS).

Meals-on-Wheels – Meals are delivered to homebound adults age 60+ and includes a check on their well-being. Meals provided to persons of ALL income levels with a suggested donation requested.

Medicare/supplemental insurance counseling – Help with filing claims, solving claim errors, appealing decisions, and understanding and comparing supplemental health insurance policies.

Senior Dining – Healthy, appetizing meals served at various locations in the county. Opportunity for visiting with friends, volunteering. Meals provided to persons of ALL income levels with a suggested donation requested.

Transportation – Information about transportation choices.

Youth Transition Services - Information about resources available when youth with disabilities reach adulthood.

Assisted Living

Community Based Residential Facilities (CBRF): Place where adults who are not related to the operator/administrator reside to receive care, treatment or services that is above the level of room & board and that may include up to three hours per week of nursing care per resident. CBRFs range in size from 5-257 beds.

Residential Care Apartment Complexes (RCAC): Independent apartment complex where 5+ adults reside, with each apartment having a lockable entrance and exit, kitchen, individual bathroom, sleeping and living area.

Adult Family Home (AFH): It's a place where 3-4 adults who are not related to the operator reside and receive care, treatment or services. The rate would reflect more than room and board. It may include up to seven hours per week of nursing care per resident. One- and Two-bed AFH's are defined & regulated differently. Hospice Services

What is it? Care for people in the last six months of life that combines medical, emotional & spiritual care.

- The patient & family can get support at home.
- Their care team includes a nurse case manager, certified nursing assistants, a social worker, a spiritual & grief counselor, trained volunteers & the patient's chosen doctor.
- Service includes regular home nursing visits, help with personal care, help connecting with community resources, education about what to expect as the illness progresses and grief support for the family.
- Care focuses on whatever is most important to the patient: comfort, dignity, family concerns, end-of-life goals, wishes and legacy.

Who is it for? People of any age who:

- Have any serious illness or life-limiting health problem,
- Are expected to live six months or less, and
- Have a primary goal of comfort, not a cure.

Where is it provided? At the patient's home, a family members' home, a skilled nursing, assisted living, community-based residential or other long-term care facility.

Licensed Home Health Care

What is it? Short-term, physician-directed care designed to help a patient prevent or recover from an illness, injury or hospital stay. Must meet specific requirements to be covered by Medicare or private insurance. Requires intermittent skilled care such as wound care, patient and caregiver education, intravenous therapy, and injections. May include Speech Therapy, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy and other support services necessary to recover.

Who is it for? Persons of any age who have complex medical needs or whose treatment requires special medical equipment or careful monitoring until condition stabilizes. It is not for persons who need more than part-time or intermittent skilled nursing care

Where is it provided? At the patient's home. It may be provided at family member's home if patient is staying there during their recovery.

Palliative Care

What is it? Supportive medical care for people who are being treated for a serious illness & are struggling with their symptoms, pain & stress.

- Nurse practitioners or doctors conduct two-hour, in-home consultations to help people find ways to feel better & cope better with their illness. During that time, the NP or doctor talks with the patient/family in detail about their symptoms, medications, treatments & goals for care, & performs a brief medical exam.
- After the visit, the NP gives the patient & their primary doctor specialized ideas to relieve their pain, other symptoms & stress.
- Follow-up visits are added, if pre-approved by the patient's doctor.
- A social worker can be called in to help with accessing needed community services.

Who is it for? People age 18 or older who:

- Have a serious illness, but are not at the end of life,
- Are not getting enough relief from medicines & other treatments, and
- Have trouble getting to the doctor or clinic because of their illness.

Where is it provided? At the patient's home, a family members' home, a skilled nursing, assisted living, community-based residential or other long-term care facility.
