Each family is given responsibilities to share in the upkeep of the facility and must fulfill these duties to remain in the program. Although YWCA does not charge any rent, tenancy, or fees to participate in the Interfaith program, it does expect a commitment on the part of each family to work hard at stabilizing and move into permanent housing. To this end, **all residents are required to either attend school or be employed and all children must attend school as a condition of residency**. Each family is provided with one-on-one case management and access to a range of critical family services including day-care, employment readiness skill-building and transportation assistance—all of which are geared toward equipping families for success in permanent housing.
