Drop-ins are accepted. All services are free except for boarder program. Sex offenders are not eligible for stay at the shelter. A state ID or drivers license is needed for entrance into shelter. A state ID/drivers license and proof of residence are needed for food pantry services. Children under 18 can accompany their legal guardian but no unaccompanied minors are served.





Homeless Day Resource Center Monday-Friday 7:30AM-3:30PM

Day shelter offering comprehensive services. Day services include social worker counseling, case management services, drug and alcohol counseling and rehab referrals. Emergency clothing closet and bag storage available. Public showers and limited laundry services also available. Also offer a public phone, fax services and limited computer/internet services. Medical services offered include adult primary care clinic, eve clinic dental clinic and psychiatric clinic with an in-house pharmacy. Patients are also offered assistance in enrolling for prescription assistance programs. Faith-based programs including optional spiritual counseling and bible study classes. A hot mid-day meal is offered at 12:00PM six days a week (no Saturday meal). The Sunday meal is offered at 2:00PM. There is a food pantry available on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9:30AM- 10:30 AM. Individuals are only eligible to access the pantry once per month. To access medical services an individual must make an appointment and have a photo ID and social security number. Medical services include an interval annual \$5.00 service charge. Most services are free, some are subsidized. Those eligible for Medicare/Medicaid or VA benefits are not eligible for service. Patients must be uninsured and under a certain income ceiling.



Individuals must show proof of income or unemployment paperwork as well as insurance information and a photo ID.



Adolescent mental services facility offering parenting assistance including parental skills classes and workshops, a parent resource center library including books, videos, magazines and computers. Also offers an in-prison parental skills class in 6 different prisons (Tucker max, Grimes Unit, Mcpherson, Wrightsville, Pine Bluff Randall Williams Unit.) Also offer inprison family literacy program at Wrightsville and McPherson for inmates with children ages 0-14 years of age. Family literacy program allows for special visitation rights for those enrolled with family literacy classes once per week- Level 1, 2 inmates with no charges against a child are eligible. Registration for classes is over the phone. Individuals enrolled in the in-prison programs have access to classes/workshops upon release free of charge. Likewise, caregivers of children of inmates can access classes free of charge. Otherwise courses cost anywhere from \$15.00 to \$40.00.
