A friend recently discovered the true meaning of the word "authentic."

She was in NYC with her family. After taking in the sights, they headed to a restaurant. On their way, they passed a young homeless veteran sitting on the sidewalk. She asked her husband, "What if we ask him to join us for lunch?" He didn't think it was a good idea. So they kept on walking.

But while she and her family were eating, my friend got up, walked back, and offered to buy him lunch. The young man agreed and accompanied her inside. And they talked. He shared how he had returned from Iraq to his only loved one who was dying from cancer. She sat quietly and listened to his story. And discovered the essence of being an authentic human being.

The world teaches us to walk by the homeless vet. Authenticity is about subverting those automatic "teachings." It's about listening to our quiet inner voice. Our curious, compassionate, creative spirit. And ignoring the loud, conditioned voice of the world. The one that pushes our buttons of fear, anger, and shame.

Here's the paradox: You're not being authentic unless you're aware that you're being authentic. That you are consciously choosing the best actions and words possible. And in an unselfconscious way.

To be authentic means to be conscious and considerate.

To be authentic means to stop being a conditioned robot.

To be authentic means to stop denying your higher, inner self.

To be authentic means to truly care about the effects of your words and actions.

FREE CULINARY SCHOOL IN CLEVELAND, OH

From the website: "EDWINS Leadership & Restaurant Institute is open to formerly-incarcerated adults in who want a second a chance. There is no charge for students to attend EDWINS, and we provide all uniforms, books and supplies. Students must be at least 18 years of age, but we do not require a minimum education level or past job experience. EDWINS does not ask any information pertaining to criminal background prior to accepting someone into the program. If you are ready to move forward, work hard, dedicate yourself and adhere to our strict attendance policy, you are welcome at EDWINS. Students from any geographic area may enroll at EDWINS, but they must provide their own transportation and accommodations to get to our institute in Cleveland, Ohio.

FREE MAIL SERVICE FOR OUTSIDE SUPPORTERS

A peculiar organization named Ameelio has an app that your outside supporters can use to send free letters or photos to you through the postal service. This text is from their website says:

"Whether it's images, postcards, or games, send them for free. We'll print and mail it for you."

When I asked if they offered the service for you to send mail, this was their reply: "Hi Sue! ...we currently only send letters to incarcerated individuals. If they want to write back, it will need to be done so independently!" (The exclamation points are not mine.)

I found out about them because the company plans to go into non-profit edtech next. (education through tablets).

BUT I HAVE TO BE CLEAR: I want you to know about them because this kind of 'philanthropy' and 'free support' comes with other costs. Companies offer "free" services, but they capture all kinds of data from the phone (and I won't go any deeper than that, but it's not 'in your best interest') and they keep all of the letters to you in digital format. It's not free; it's more like a trade. But I would not call it fair trade.

"When it the product is free, you are the product." Common saying

With all that, if you are able to experience the service, and if you'd be willing to share your experience with FS and/or the readers here, I think we'd all be eager to hear how it goes! (I would have tried it if it was a website...but I don't download apps) (update: I have a verification from an incarcerated person whose family uses the post cards and he and his family like the service.)

Book recommendation:

THINGS FALL APART by Chinua Achebe (1958) Everyman Books

This is a 'classic' for African students, and students around the globe. I did not learn about this book in school, I learned about it recently from a friend. I'm so glad I read it. It is a short and very intense story about the colonization of Nigeria around 1890..with a fictional village and characters. It is a story about changing within change; and looking at how we respond to change. The publisher says "it provides us with a powerful fable about the immemorial conflict between the individual and society." When we are in very difficult circumstances, it is very hard to know what the best thing is to do. We are experiencing quite a changing time now. I think this book can help us think about how we want to approach change in a turbulent time. The introduction is by Kwame Anthony Appiah, an African historian and also a rare practical philosopher who not only writes very interesting books about identity and morals, but he is also an "Ethicist" for the New York Times.
