Who We Are:


Wisconsin Books to Prisoners (WBTP) is an all-volunteer, non-profit project of A Room of One's Own Bookstore, an independent bookstore in Madison offering a wide selection of current and classic fiction, nonfiction, and periodicals. WBTP has been active since 2006.

Our Mission:

Wisconsin Books to Prisoners' mission is to foster a love of reading behind bars, encourage the pursuit of knowledge and selfempowerment, and help break the cycle of recidivism.

What We Do:

Prisoners write to us directly requesting books, typically by topic or author. Volunteers meet weekly to read letters, select books from the WBTP library, wrap and mail packages.



Why:

Incarcerated people face significant barriers to being able to access books and information. Prison libraries are often antiquated and poorly funded, and educational and vocational programs for prisoners are nearly non-existent.

WBTP volunteers love to read and want to ensure the same freedom for those living behind bars. We believe that books are tools for learning and can open minds to new ideas and possibilities.

Donate Books:

The range of interests that prisoners have in the world is as broad and varied as any population outside of prison. Donations of books across the entire spectrum of fiction and nonfiction subjects are appreciated. Books about occupational trades and how to start a business are frequently requested as well as history books, reference books, urban lit, philosophy, and books on learning languages and how to draw.


